Contest Rules

The "Whoppers" should be short (humorous, dramatic, supernatural, etc.) with a maximum length of 5 minutes. Timing devices will be used to signal, 4 minutes and five minutes. (Anyone exceeding the time limit of 5 minutes 30 seconds will be disqualified.)

2 All contestants must register prior to 6:30 pm on the day of the contest (6/11).

3 Judging will be done by a panel of three storytelling experts who will score each contestant in the following categories:

- a. Technique delivery, general stage presence.
- b. Story Development of the tale in time available.
- c. Originality new material or fresh handling of a familiar yarn.
- d. Effectiveness taking audience response into consideration.

The judges will score each of the four categories on a scale of 1-5. The judges will confer at the end of the contest to decide the winners. The decision of the judges will be final. Final scores will not be given to contestants.

Awards ceremony will take place following the Featured Storyteller's Performance at 9:00 pm
